There With Care Bay Area www.bayarea.therewithcare.org **For Families and Children Facing Critical Illness**

There With Care Bay Area provides a wide range of services to families and children during the critical phase of a medical crisis. This may apply to any type of hospitalization for Nephrotic Syndrome, including relapse, transplant, or other complications from NS. If you are treated at UCSF or LPCH you are eligible for this program. Talk to your social worker to be connected. If eligible, may cover anything from grocery costs, child care, transportation, rent, etcl, during the hospitalization / crisis.

There With Care also has branches in Boulder and Denver, Colorado.

First Hand Foundation www.firsthandfoundation.org

First Hand Foundation provides funding for children with health-related needs when insurance and other financial resources have been exhausted. They cover treatment costs, equipment, devices, lodging, transportation and more. Income restrictions apply. Check site for details.

United Health Care Children's Foundation - UHCCF www.uhccf.org

UHCCF provides financial help for families with children that have medical needs not covered or not fully covered by their insurance plan. Children must be 16 years old or younger. Some income and insurance restrictions apply to qualify for benefits. Check their website for details.

Needy Meds Patient Assistance Programs www.needymeds.org

NeedyMeds is a resource to help people locate assistance programs for medications and other healthcare costs. They have a large range of benefits, some of which are NOT need based. We encourage you to check their website for resources that apply to you. You can search by drug or disease to find resources. Here are a few of the programs they list:

- **Financial Assistance Programs** (from various sources) - typically based on financial income levels. Search www.needymeds.org.
- **Drug Discount Card** - Needy Meds Discount card that may help reduce costs of prescription AND over the counter medications. Cannot be used with insurance, but NOT need based.

- **Co-pay assistance programs** - Find programs for Nephrotic Syndrome drugs at needymeds.org. Some NOT need based.
