Acute or Chronic Health Conditions: was diagnosed with nephrotic syndrome in September 2021. She is followed by her pediatrician and nephrologist at this condition. Nephrotic syndrome is a rare autoimmune disease that attacks the kidneys causing them to leak large amounts of protein into the urine, or in severe cases shut down entirely. This is a chronic disease with no cure, but with treatment it can be managed or put into periods of remission. She is currently being treated with oral steroids (prednisolone), IV monoclonal antibodies (Rituximab) and an oral acid reducer (famotidine) for stomach upset.

It often takes a considerable amount of time for physicians to find the right combination of medications with the least number of side effects to control this condition. Future treatments might include fluid restrictions, diuretics, antihypertensives, or additional immunosuppressant medications. Many patients do outgrow their symptoms later in life, so the plan is to control condition as best as possible until she reaches this time.

condition can worsen/be triggered by conditions such as exposure to colds/influenza/viruses, and bug bites. Her parents check her urine daily at home to monitor for protein. They also watch for symptoms such as swelling around the eyelids, belly and legs.

Classroom/School Based Plans

2.	muscle fatigue	d use and side effects. Steroids can cause side effects that might include e/bone pain, weight gain, puffy/swollen face, mood swings, insomnia, hunger, e, heartburn and nausea/stomach pain Allow breaks and quiet time if mood swings or anxiety are impacting her day
	h	Allow to eat and drink in class as needed
		Create a positive environment that supports changing body. Monitor for teasing or bullying related to weight gain
