

Director, Development - Job Description

The Nephrotic Syndrome Foundation is in the early stages of growth, and we are looking for a dynamic individual with the experience and drive to take our Foundation to the next level. The individual in this role will be a critical player in the future success of NSF as we seek the funding needed to make an impact on this fight.

Hours & Commitment: Applicants should be able to offer a minimum of 20-25 hours a week, bringing energy, passion, commitment and determination to the role. Hours, roles & responsibilities can be adjusted for the right candidate based on expertise and personal situation. Compensation will depend on candidate qualifications.

Roles & Responsibilities:

- Manage all aspects of development, including identifying new opportunities, completing and submitting grant applications / requests for support and following up on submissions.
- Research new prospects and opportunities, quantifying and prioritizing them, building, managing and forecasting an active pipeline for opportunities 6 - 18 months out.
- Prepare and submit grant reports for awarded grants.
- Draft letters / emails of introduction for new opportunities / sources of funding, focusing on private foundations / philanthropic individuals / corporations and / or private businesses.
- Execute on annual budget, securing incremental funding needed to support of F&D plan.
- Develop and foster relationships with current and new funding organizations and high level donors to maintain and grow pipeline support ongoing development.
- Assist in and steward relationships with donors and providers (UCSF, Kaiser, LPCH, etc.) as needed, identifying and pursuing related development opportunities.
- Work with the local community and local NSF Team to find corporate sponsors and negotiate involvement in events including potential partnerships and / or campaigns.
- Offer expertise in non-profit organization / operations as it relates to development and / or fundraising. Advise on and implement best practices and process improvement.
- To the extent time allows, plan and execute fundraising and other development events.
- Correspond with patient families with compassion, respect and understanding to further our reach and impact as it relates to fundraising and development.
- Coordinate as needed on media / press as related to development and events.
- Collaborate with and support Founder in all areas to ensure NSF is positioned for growth & impact.

Qualifications / skills required:

- Minimum of BA or BS Degree.
- Minimum 5+ years in past management roles.
- Minimum 5+ years experience in non-profit space.
- Fundraising and / or grant writing experience.
- Knowledge of & ability to efficiently navigate grant databases & research opportunities.
- High level of proficiency using AI as a tool.
- Proven ability to meet deliverables, stay organized and driven in a dynamic environment.
